Education Health and Care Plans

Guidance was published late yesterday by the DfE on temporary changes to education, health and care legislation during the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak.

These changes are being reviewed and we will advise parents of any impact locally as soon as possible.

Arrangements will then be made for these to be collected or delivered in line with social distancing guidelines.

Education Health and Care Plans – update

Since the publication of new guidance by the DfE last Friday we have been considering the detail and talking to our partners, including the Parent Carer Forum, to agree how best to meet the requirements.

Having done this, we plan to continue to work within the current timescales **for all EHCP processes**, unless there are exceptional circumstances, such as a child/young person arriving in the area that we do not have any information about.

We will also build on the processes we have put in place with schools and partners over the last few weeks and record any changes in provision that need to be made.
